Project aim(s)

This project was the first LED energy project in the Western Isles, helping families and individuals save energy, money and carbon at home.

Project scope and size

This project was the first LED energy project in the Western Isles, helping families and individuals save energy, money and carbon at home. Don't think this should be repeated

The project officer of this exciting project is replacing older lighting with up to 14 LED light bulbs in homes that sign up to the project. Low energy LED light bulbs help to save up to 80 - 90% of the household's lighting bill as they use less energy to run. In helping people save energy the project also aims to help reduce fuel poverty in the trust area.

Alongside having LED bulbs installed in their homes householders will receive a home visit and energy survey, conducted by our project officer. This survey may identify options for TIG to further lever in funding for home insulation measures. The project officer will also offer advice and support on other schemes as well as referrals to TIG's Care and Repair department or signposting to other organisations such as Home Energy Scotland (HES) for new heating systems.

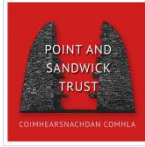
