## Project aim(s)

Founded in 2015, Hebrides Energy Community Interest Company (Hebrides Energy) aims to deliver a community electricity tariff for households and business customers in the Outer Hebrides to help alleviate the levels of fuel poverty in the islands. The company initially entered into partnership with GB Energy Supply and made the Hebrides Energy electricity tariff available to the local market in 2016. The following year, Our Power became the replacement supplier for the white label, offering competitive tariffs for local households until they ceased trading in January 2020.

Hebrides Energy continues to seek out a new partnership supply, and In parallel with this, Hebrides Energy continues to pursue its longer term aspirations to become a fully licensed supplier and to directly invest in, and retail locally generated renewable energy, in order to achieve greater cost savings.

## Project scope and size

The shareholders in the company are:- Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, Community Energy Scotland, Stornoway Trust, Tighean Innse Gall and Hebridean Housing Partnership (HHP). Tighean Innse Gall raise community awareness of the tariffs available as well as providing accurate advice and information to potential customers, whilst remaining impartial.
